NCF Seeking Community Preservation Act Funds to Build Public Access Community Gardening Beds

We need your help! The Needham Community Farm (NCF) seeks \$200,000 to build 150, 4 by 12-foot, raised beds that would be available to rent to members of the community. Fifteen of the

beds would be 44 inches in height for those who are physically challenged, and 15 beds would be available at reduced or no cost to those who are residents of public housing or SNAP eligible.

On Wednesday, March 16, 2022, at 7 PM, the Community Preservation Committee will be holding a public hearing in order to determine the community's interest and demand for community gardening beds. We urge you to attend virtually as the hearing room at the PSA building is not large. Key NCF Board members will attend in person. Keep an eye out for an email from us later this week with further information.
